

Sacred Heart Volleyball On Top Of State In Division 4

It was finally Mount Pleasant Sacred Heart's turn for a volleyball Division 4 state championship.

The Irish had come close to contending for the title several times but finally got the job done in 2022.

Coach Krista Davis' team was able to storm to district and regional titles. But Davis and her team knew it would be a tough quarterfinal test against perennial power Leland. The Irish prevailed 25-21, 14-25, 25-15, 26-24.

"We just matched up a little bit better with them this time around," Davis said. "They didn't have as much of a balanced attack as they typically did in the past. Overall, I think we were a better team.

"Coming into the season, it was a rebuilding year. We graduated eight seniors from that semifinal team. To be honest, we were terrible in August. We got aced 40 times in the course of our very first tournament. The only way to go was up. They showed up every day and put in the work"

Last season was the first time Sacred Heart had made it to the Final Four.

Brown was a four-year starter and led the team in kills. Laney was a three-year starter and ran a lot of fast and quick attacks for MPSH. She was the team's blocking leader. Pieratt was a second-year setter and was the No. 1 server.

Hunter Jones of Benzie Central won the race in 14:46.50. Clayton Ackley of Hart was second in 15:52.14, just 0.03 seconds ahead of Allen.

Dakota Dykhuis' performance for Montabella at the state finals was a good one. His coach Dan Gibson couldn't say enough.

"Last season Dakota was a dual sport athlete playing football and running cross country," Gibson said. "He had a very successful season as he qualified for the state finals and finished 34th at the state meet. This year he decided to commit to cross country and not play football. "Gage ran his first 5K when he was 5-years old and has never stopped," Sargeant said. "He ran with the CMMS cross country team beginning in fifth grade, running with his two older sisters (Kyah and Téa)

"He begins his cross training in June, he gets 2-to-3 weeks off after track to relax. He wrestled as a youth, and is going to give the 106-pound weight class a try this year. He is also planning on running track, which he did all through MS).

He enjoys the hurdles and the 400 meters, but maybe his distance coach could talk him into the mile."

Hoffman was happy with his state finals effort.

"Gage is a spitfire," Sargeant said. "He can't sit still and is always on the go. He trains hard, he works hard, and I can't wait to see how his running career pans out. Gage had an outstanding season starting in the summer

His personal record this year was 16:24 First team All conference. He was 3rd at regionals and ninth at state finals.

"I was happy with my placement," Hoffman said. "I think it went well. It was a fun experience with all my coaches, family and friends there. I was really happy with my time and placement and am excited for next

"Gage put in a lot of work this offseason knowing he had high goals for his freshman year," Sargent said. "The first time I worked with him this summer I was amazed and immediately excited about his potential. The keys to Gage's success are his work ethic, attention to detail, competitiveness, and drive to succeed.

"This is my first year with Gage and I would say his most memorable moment getting ninth at the state competition. He was ranked in the mid 20's with the goal of getting All-State. It's a challenge for most at any point in their career. Gage took the challenge of the big stage and completely surpassed expectations. A top 10 finish at the state meet as a freshman is very rare."

"I exceeded my expectations," he said. "At state I was hoping for top 30. It was a great season."
