Area Football Players Making Plenty Of News During Offseason

It may be spring but the football season never really ends and several area football players are in the news this spring. Be it high school seniors making major college commitments or college players finding opportunity in the NFL or another college, several area football players have been making news this season.

Following is a look at some of the area football players in the news:

Sy Barnett To Get Opportunity With Saints

Former Williamston standout Sy Barnett will have a chance to make an NFL roster after he signed with the New Orleans Saints as an undrafted free agent following the recent NFL draft. A 6-0 foot, 192-pound wide



receiver, Barnett earned honorable-mention, all-American honors at Davenport University last season and was named first-team, all-Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference.

Northwood, SVSU Players Sign NFL Deals

Local Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference schools Saginaw Valley State and Northwood University both had players sign free agent deals with NFL teams.

At Northwood, John Hall became the first Northwood football player to sign with an NFL team since 2014 when he inked a deal with the Seattle Seahawks.

Saginaw Valley State had a pair of players sign free agent deals with NFL teams. Linebacker Trevor Nowaske signed a deal with the Detroit Lions while cornerback Nick Whiteside, a two-time, all-American at SVSU, signed a deal with the Washington Commanders.

St. Johns Grad Going To Oklahoma

Former St. Johns standout Konnor Near benefitted from the new landscape in college football where small-school standouts are using the transfer portal to get an opportunity to play at high-level Division 1 schools. A first-team, Division 2 all-American and two-time national champion at Ferris State University, Near entered

the transfer portal this spring and accumulated a host of major Division 1 offers before deciding to transfer to the University of Oklahoma. Near, a 6-foot-2, 234-pound linebacker, recently visited Michigan State University where he received an offer before eventually committing to Oklahoma. Near also received offers from high-profile schools like Texas Tech, Cincinnati, Georgia Tech, Duke, Washington State and Appalachia State.

Mt. Pleasant Football Players Make College Commits

A pair of Mt. Pleasant football players who are ranked among the top rising seniors in the state already know where they will be playing their college football.

Logan Borodychuk, an all-state quarterback currently turning in a big season with the Mt. Pleasant baseball team, will be staying close to home to play his college football. Borodychuk, ranked as one of the top quarterbacks in the state of Michigan for next season, has committed to playing for the Central Michigan Chippewas.

Another Mt. Pleasant all-state player, offensive lineman Andrew Dennis, will be playing college football in the Big Ten. Dennis, a 6-foot-5, 275-pound lineman ranked by Rivals.com as the No. 11-ranked prospect in the entire state, has made a commitment to Michigan State University after being recruited by national powerhouses like Michigan, Ohio State and Penn State.

Mt. Pleasant To Play Foe From Canada Next Season

With Logan Borodychuk and Andrew Dennis set for their senior seasons, the Mt. Pleasant football team is poised for an exciting season. That season was made even more exciting this spring when the Oilers announced an addition to their football schedule this fall. Mt. Pleasant will be hosting Canadian prep powerhouse St. Thomas More from Ontario, Canada. One of the premier programs in Canada, St. Thomas More was the number-one team in Canada three out of the past six seasons.

Saginaw Heritage Standout To Play In MIAA

Saginaw Heritage standout wide receiver Braylon Isom will be taking his talents to the Mid-American Conference after his senior season.

An all-state receiver last fall for the Hawks, Isom is one of the top high school receivers in the state. Isom recently announced his plans for his post-high school career with a commitment to Miami University of the Mid-American Conference.

Williamston Duo To Play In The MIAA

A pair of Williamston football players will be continuing their careers this fall in the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Conference.

Linebacker Joe Mahaney will be playing at Hope College this fall while offensive center/defensive tackle Will Geiger will be playing at Kalamazoo College next season.

Area Baseball Teams Off To Sizzling Starts Despite Chilly Weather

While the wet and chilly spring weather has made it difficult to play baseball, several area teams are off to sizzling starts. Following is a look at some of the top baseball teams in the area.

Bay City Western Among Best In State

Led by a deep and talented pitching staff, Bay City Western is one of the top teams in the state in Division 1.

The Warriors are ranked second in the state in Division 1 and opened the season with a perfect 12-0 record. Western has turned in a number of impressive efforts including doubleheader sweeps of Flushing, Saginaw Heritage, Midland and Midland Dow. Included along the way was veteran coach Tim McDonald winning his 800th career game.

A big key to Western's success this spring is a deep and talented pitching staff. As a team, the Warriors have a 1.17 team ERA.

Senior pitcher Ben Kochany, a Saginaw Valley State recruit, is off to a strong start with a 5-0 record and a 0.35 ERA. Sophomore pitcher Luke LaCourse, one of the top sophomores in the state, is also off to a strong start as he is 2-0 with two saves and has struck out 26 batters in 17 innings pitched. Senior pitcher Cole Schmidt, who has committed to Mott Community College, is 3-0 while sophomore pitcher Brayden Simmon is 2-0 with a 1.68 ERA and 28 strikeouts in 16 innings pitched.

Western also features a productive offense. Senior first baseman Ryker DeCaire is off to a blistering start this season as he is hitting .629 with 19 RBI. Sophomore Jack Sequin is hitting .429 while junior leadoff hitter Aidan Robinson is hitting .375 with 24 runs scored.

Okemos Baseball Team State-Ranked In D1

The Okemos baseball team is ranked 16th in the state in Division 1. The Wolves opened the season with a 10-3-1 record and have turned in some solid efforts including doubleheader sweeps of both Holt and DeWitt. Okemos also defeated Detroit Catholic Central 4-0 and defeated Detroit Country Day, the No. 8-ranked team in Division 2, 8-2. Okemos is led in the field by one of the premier juniors in the state of Michigan in shortstop Caleb Bonemer who has committed to the University of Virginia. Bonemer hit three home runs in the first nine games of the season and is hitting around .600.

Rockford Baseball Off To Strong Start

The Rockford baseball team is off to a strong start this season. The Rams opened the season with a 15-2 record and are ranked sixth in the state in Division 1. The Rams have a veteran squad with 13 players back from last year's team that turned in a 25-8 record.

Bullock Creek In The Top Ten In D2

Bullock Creek is off to a fast start this season winning 11 of its first 12 games and are ranked ninth in the state in Division 2. The Lancers

are led by a dynamic one-two combination on the mound in seniors Andrew Young and Nathan Masar. Young, a two-time, all-state selection was 9-0 with a 1.29 ERA last season while Masar, an honorable-mention, all-state pick, went 11-1 with a 2.43 ERA and hit .393 at the plate.

Bay City John Glenn Among Best In The State

Bay City John Glenn is one of the top teams in the state this year. The Bobcats, who started the season with an 11-4 record, are ranked fifth in the state in Division 2 and are ranked the eighth-best team in the state regardless of class by Prep Baseball Report.

The Bobcats are a veteran squad led by senior Tanner Sonntag, one of the top pitchers in the state. Sonntag, who has committed to Oakland University, Sonntag is joined by returning senior all-stars Nathan Ball and Brody Krzysiak. Ball, a power-hitting first baseman, will play his college baseball at Northwood University while Krzysiak, a hard-hitting shortstop, is headed to Oakland University.

Williamston Looking Strong In CAAC Red

Williamston is off to a strong start in the Capital Area Activities Conference Red Division this spring.

The Hornets improved their conference record to 4-0 with a doubleheader sweep of Fowlerville that included a pair of standout pitching performances. Junior pitcher Braydon Johnson fired a no-hitter while junior pitcher Aiden Friess tossed a complete game shutout as the Hornets claimed a pair of wins to remain atop the league standings. Johnson and Friess have been anchoring the pitching staff this spring. Friess if 4-0 this season with a 0.84 ERA while Johnson has a 3-0 record with a 1.47 ERA. Junior pitcher Ben Covey has been stellar in relief as he has recorded a pair of saves and has a 0.00 ERA.

Williamston also features a potent offense. Senior centerfielder Joe Mahaney is the table setter of the offense as he leads the team in runs with 15 and stolen bases with six. Mahaney is also hitting .341 with a home run and eight RBI. Friess is also turning in a big season at the

plate as he is hitting .421 with two home runs and nine RBI. Covey is tied for the team lead in RBI with 10 and is hitting .371 with five doubles. Junior infielder/pitcher Richard Cuzydlo also has 10 RBI and is hitting .394. Junior catcher/infielder/pitcher Carter Gulick is hitting .341 with eight RBI and four stolen bases while freshman pitcher/utility Miles Keener is hitting .370 with eight RBI and four stolen bases.

Freeland Starting The Season Strong

The Freeland baseball team opened the season winning 11 of its first 13 games with close losses to Clare and Frankenmuth. The Falcons are ranked 11th in the state in Division 2 by Prep Baseball Report and 13th in the state in the coach's poll.

Freeland is led by one of the top junior pitchers in the state in Dan Duley, a lefthander who has a fastball clocked in the upper 80s. Pitching is a strong point for the Falcons who have recorded five shutouts this season as of the end of April. Jacob Kowalski, Brady Shavrnock and Jacob Clawson have also been contributing on the mound this season.

Ithaca Baseball Team Putting Together Strong Season Despite Lack Of Numbers

There may not be many players on the Ithaca baseball team this spring, but the players the Yellowjackets do have are helping the team fashion a solid season.

Ithaca has a total of 13 players on the roster and with three of them injured right now, the Yellowjackets rely on an "all hands on deck" approach for every game. Despite the low numbers, the Yellowjackets are turning in a solid season while playing a challenging schedule.

"The injury bug has hit us and the pitch-count rule has really impacted us," said Ithaca coach Brian LeBaron. "With all the doubleheaders we've had due to

the weather the pitch count really hurts us. We are having to use kids to pitch that have never pitched before. We normally have two or three games a week but with the postponed games we are having to play two or three doubleheaders a week and that really impacts our pitching staff when you factor in the pitch count."

The injuries have also had a major impact. The biggest injury came when the Yellowjackets lost returning all-state outfielder and pitcher Ethan Hull. Hull was lost to an injury in late April and may be sidelined until the middle of May.

Even without Hull, Ithaca has a solid core of players led by senior Charlie Martyn. A catcher, shortstop and pitcher, Martyn is a solid all-around player who will

play in college at Alma College.

A pair of sophomores are also turning in strong seasons. Ryley White is the team's centerfielder and leadoff hitter and is hitting around .400 this spring. Collin Thruso also plays the outfield and is a pitcher.

Senior Caleb Peska provides strong leadership and is a solid all-around player who plays first base, third base and catcher.

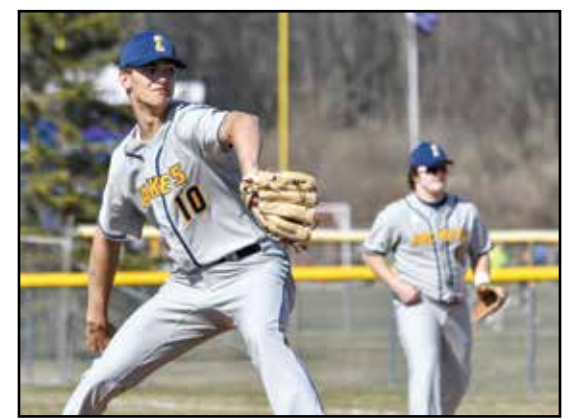
The lineup is getting a boost with the return of senior Trenton Polish who went out with an injury after the first game of the season. Polish is a solid hitter who plays the outfield and first base.

Freshman Bredy Paradise is making a big impact in his first season of high school baseball.

Paradise is the team's starting shortstop and also helps with the pitching.

"Brady is a baseball kid," LaBaron said. "Every once in a while, you get a kid like that who just loves the game. Brady just loves baseball and he is doing a nice job for us."

Despite playing a challenging schedule, Ithaca has been racking up some impressive wins. Ithaca won the title at the Beaverton Invitational in late April where the Yellowjackets defeated a state-ranked Gladstone team from the

Upper Peninsula 4-3 and also defeated Beaverton.

"We have hard-nosed kids that don't quit," LaBaron said. "We're short on numbers but we do have some good pitching. We haven't found our groove yet hitting but the guys have been working on it. Our goal is to win a league championship and a district title."

Conner Bailey Off To A Fast Start For Haslett Baseball Team This Spring

The coaches expect team speed and pitching depth to be strengths while team commitment to work hard and play fundamental baseball will be areas for improvement.

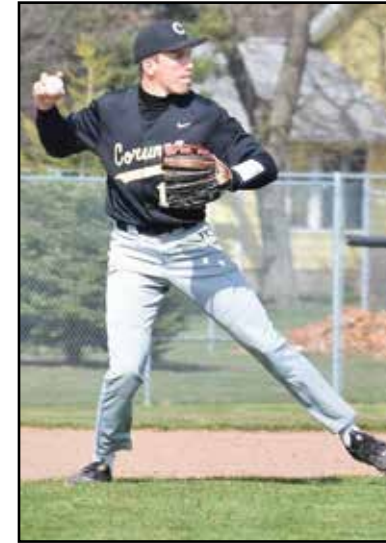
"Jack Pine will be strong this year," Novak said. "Six teams will be in contention this year. Clare

"Other key mentions are Ivy Davenport and Kennedy Ryan

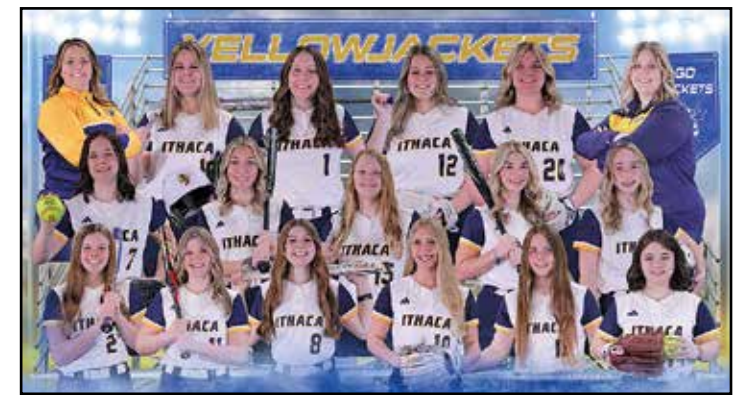

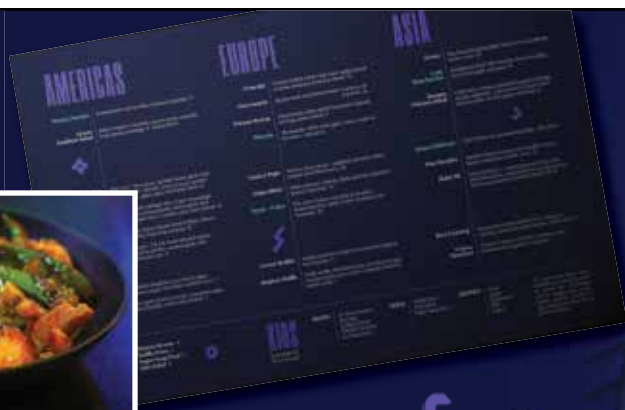
