A trio of area soccer teams were ranked in Division 3 with Williamston at number five followed by Flint Powers at six and Essexville-Garber at seven. In Division 4, Valley Lutheran was ranked third and Saginaw Nouvel sixth.

Area golfers are also teeing it up for what will be some outstanding state tournament golf and the upcoming state finals.

Potterville Baseball Team Puts Together Special Season

Potterville baseball coach Chris Aldinger has had reason to smile this season.

"Season highlights so far is we're able to beat Blanchard Montabella 5-3 in our home invitational early in the season," Aldinger said. "We were also able to defeat conference rival Dansville 5-3 in a wood bat tournament at Maple Valley. The latter was a big turnaround after Dansville beat us soundly, at home, just nine days prior. That win stands out as it showed an unparalleled level of grit and determination from our team."

Top athletes have included Braden Mirelis, who is the senior

captain.

"Braden has the top average on the team at .377," Aldinger said. "He also has a top OBP of .529 with a 1.0000 OPS. He has 20 hits including five doubles. He also has 13 runs scored and 13 RBIs. He has eight stolen bases. On the mound Braden has 50 strikeouts in 41 2/3 innings of work. Braden also shows great leadership skills on the field and always motivates his teammates to be their best."

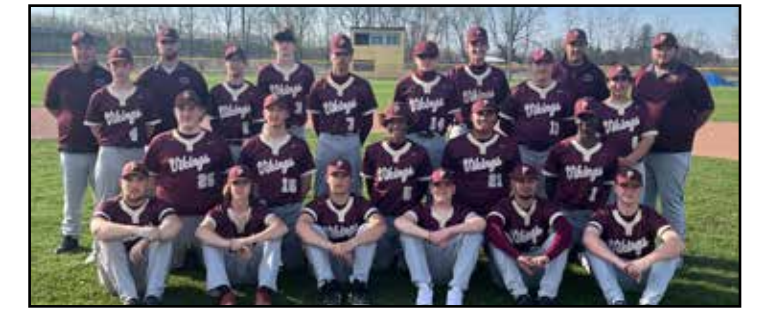
"Austin Thompson is our junior captain. Due to an early season slump Austin's offensive stats are not what they should be. However, his defense at first base and his leadership qualities on and off the field make him a top athlete. On the mound Austin is 1-1 with

15 strikeouts with 16 1/3 innings pitched."

Aldinger said Austin Dickerson "is a senior third baseman pitcher. Austin is another player who slumped early in the season but has come on strong in the month of May. Austin has also pitched 37 innings striking out 27 batters. Austin has been a leader in the dugout and a positive role model, especially for the freshmen and sophomores."

Kaleb Batterham "is hitting .253 with a .424 OBP and an OPS of .758," Aldinger said. "Kaleb has 9 RBI and 13 runs scored. He is also the team leader in stolen bases with 15."

"Our team's strength this season has been our resiliency. Each and every game our players work hard and improve. Our team needs to work on situational awareness and communication. This has improved over the course of the season but is definitely something we are

working on.

"Our conference has been tough. The CMAC is one of the best conferences in the state. However, this high level of competition has helped us improve. Some reachable goals are to win a district title and to cut down on preventable errors. Both are attainable through hard work. The keys to reaching these goals are cut out mental mistakes, and situational awareness.

"Our team came into the season very inexperienced. They have continued to work hard and from top to bottom have improved in every facet of the game. Each and every one of these players gives 110 percent day in and day out. The work ethic and no quit mentality of these players is a credit to their athletic ability as well as their personal character."

Highlights have included with

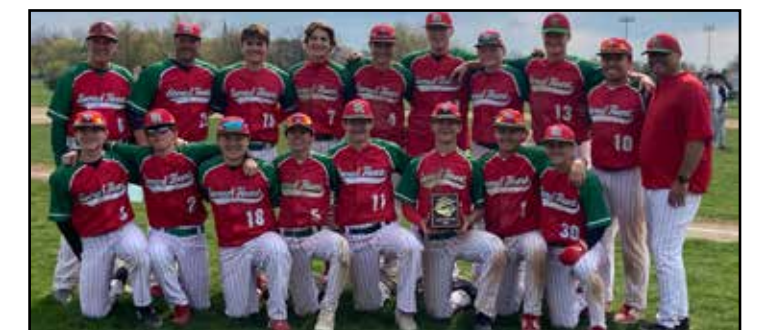

High School Baseball State Tournament Preview

The high school baseball state tournament begins the first weekend of June with district play. Following is a look at some of the area districts where teams begin the road to the state baseball finals.

DIVISION 1

@DEWITT

Teams to watch: Okemos, Grand Ledge, DeWitt

Favorite: Okemos

Skinny: Okemos enters the state tournament with 20 wins to its credit. The Wolves have been ranked in the state poll during the season and have a deep and talented team led by standout junior shortstop Caleb Bonemer. Okemos enters the state tournament on a roll after defeating DeWitt 7-1 in the quarterfinals of the Capital Classic in a game where the Wolves enjoyed a balanced attack with Bonemer, Andrew Golde, Colin Walton and Ray Smith all recording two hits apiece. Grand Ledge finished the regular season with an 18-13 record and could see Okemos in the finals if

it can get past host DeWitt in the semifinals.

@MARQUETTE

Teams to watch: Mt. Pleasant, Traverse City Central, Traverse City West

Favorite: Mt. Pleasant

Skinny: To win a district title the Mt. Pleasant baseball team will not only have to contend with some strong Traverse City squads, but will have to deal with some serious travel miles as it makes the trip to Marquette for the district. Mt. Pleasant does have an ace in the hole in coach Luke Epple who has seen it all since taking over as Mt. Pleasant head coach in 1994 and recently recorded his 800th career win. Mt. Pleasant is no stranger to taking road trips as the Oilers have racked up plenty of miles already with trips to East Grand Rapids, Muskegon, Mona Shores, Grosse Pointe South and Davison. Mt. Pleasant enters the state tournament with over 20 wins this season and a balanced offense that features a lineup led by Marcus Castellon, Tyler Hutchins, Aidan Klein, Nate Koster, Caleb Neubecker and Griffin Phillips. The Oilers also have a solid group of pitchers including Blake Moore, Seth DeLeon and Castellon. Traverse City Central, led by senior pitching standout Josh Klug who is headed to the University of Louisville, will be a major hurdle for the Oilers, however Mt. Pleasant opened the season with a 14-7 win against Traverse City Central.

@MIDLAND DOW

Teams to watch: Bay City Western, Midland, Midland Dow, Saginaw Heritage

Favorite: Bay City Western

Skinny: One of the most competitive districts in the state, the Midland Dow district has a trio of teams that have won over 20 games this season. Bay City Western comes in as the favorite. Western is ranked second in the state in Division 1 and wrapped up the regular season with a record of 21-0-2. Western combines outstanding pitching with a deep and talented batting order. The Western pitching staff is paced by seniors Ben Kochany and Cole Schmidt along with talented sophomores Luke LaCourse and Brayden Simmons. The Western offense is led by senior Ryker

DeCaire, junior Aidan Robinson and sophomore Jack Sequin. Midland entered the district with a 25-10 regular-season record while Midland Dow finished the regular season with a 21-15 overall record.

@FOREST HILLS NORTHERN

Teams to watch: Rockford, Cedar Springs, Grand Rapids Northview

Favorite: Rockford

Skinny: Rockford is ranked fifth in the state in Division 1 and is primed for a deep tournament run. The Rams boast an outstanding pitching staff and have been tested against a loaded schedule against the likes of OK Red rivals Hudsonville, Grandville and Jenison and have recorded impressive non-league wins against Grand Ledge, Zeeland West and East Grand Rapids.

DIVISION 2

@FOWLERVILLE

Teams to watch: Williamston, Haslett, Fowlerville

Favorite: Williamston

Skinny: Williamston enters the tournament on a hot streak winning seven of its last nine games to get to the 20-win mark. The Hornets combine a productive offense with some strong pitching. At the plate Ben Covey is hitting .406 while Aiden Friess is hitting .405 and Brayden Johnson .382. Carter Gulick has driven in 21 runs while Richard Cuzdylo and Ben Judit each have 20 RBI. On the mound Friess, Judit and Johnson each have below 2.40 ERAs. Haslett is a dangerous team led by Conner Bailey who has been getting the job done on the mound, at the plate and on the field for the Vikings.

@OWOSSO

Teams to watch: Flint Powers, Corunna, Lake Fenton

Favorite: Flint Powers

Skinny: This is one of the strongest Division 2 districts in the state. Flint Powers comes into the district ranked fifth in the state in D2. The Chargers have played a challenging schedule all season and have recorded a pair of wins against Mt. Pleasant and split

doubleheaders with both Midland and Midland Dow along with sweeping Davison. Corunna is ranked 15th in the state in D2 and has over 20 wins this season. Lake Fenton is a dangerous team that has a pair of wins against Corunna.

@SWAN VALLEY

Teams to watch: Swan Valley, Carrollton

Favorite: Swan Valley

Skinny: Swan Valley has turned in a solid season with over 20 wins. The Vikings will be tough to beat on their home field. Swan Valley features some solid pitching from the likes of Aaron Smith and Joey Miller while the offense is led by Tyler Durussel, Colton Klein and Jaxon Hartley.

Teams to watch: Frankenmuth, Clio, Flint Kearsley

Skinny: Frankenmuth is a strong favorite in this district and boasts one of the top pitchers in the area in Drew Titsworth. Clio has a solid squad that has played a tough schedule while Kearsley is a dangerous squad capable of pulling an upset.

Teams to watch: Big Rapids, Gladwin, Ludington

Favorite: Gladwin

Skinny: This district features a pair of heavyweights who unfortunately meet in the pre-district game. Big Rapids and Gladwin have both won more than 25 games and would make for a great district final but face off in the first round.

@BAY CITY JOHN GLENN

Teams to watch: Bay City John Glenn, Bullock Creek, Freeland, Shepherd

Favorite: Bay City John Glenn

Skinny: One of the deepest and toughest districts in the state, all five teams are district-championship caliber. Four of the five teams in this district have over 20 wins. Bullock Creek is ranked eighth in the state in D2 and is led by pitching aces Andrew Young and Nathan Masar. Bay City John Glenn is ranked ninth in the state and has a one-two pitching combo of Brody Krzysiak and Tanner Sontag who are both headed to Oakland University. Krzysiak also leads the offense along with Brady Rogers and Nathan Ball. Freeland also enters the district with 23 wins this season.

@BELDING

Teams to watch: Forest Hills Eastern, Portland, St. Johns, Ionia

Favorite: Forest Hills Eastern

Skinny: Another loaded district. Forest Hills Eastern is ranked sixth in the state in Division 2 and boasts a potent offense to go along with some outstanding pitching. St. Johns has turned in a strong season but will have a tough road to the district final having to face Ionia and Portland who have also

After opening the season with a pair of losses to Vicksburg, the Eagles have won 29 out of their next 30 games behind a dominating pitching staff and an explosive offense. Host Lakewood-Lake Odessa has played .500 ball this spring and will look to take a shot at Olivet in the title game.

DIVISION 3

@VERMONTVILLE MAPLE VALLEY

Teams to watch: Lansing Catholic, Pewamo-Westphalia, Vermontville Maple Valley

Favorite: Lansing Catholic

Skinny: Lansing Catholic is ranked sixth in the state in D3 and has tested itself against a rugged schedule this season. The Cougars can produce plenty of runs and have solid pitching and defense. Pewamo-Westphalia and Maple Valley are a pair of teams that won around 20 games each this year that play in the other semifinal in what is a rugged district. Pewamo-Westphalia is ranked 12th in the state and boasts a lineup full of solid hitters as well as some talented pitching arms.

@DURAND

Teams to watch: Laingsburg, Durand, Perry

Favorite: Laingsburg

Skinny: Laingsburg turned in an impressive regular season racking up 23 wins. The Wolfpack can score runs in bunches and has been getting some impressive pitching performances. Perry and Durand both turned in winning records during the regular season and either one will provide a hurdle for Laingsburg in the final.

Skinny: Montrose claimed a pair of wins over both New Lothrop and Mt. Morris this season and looks to be the team to beat at this district.

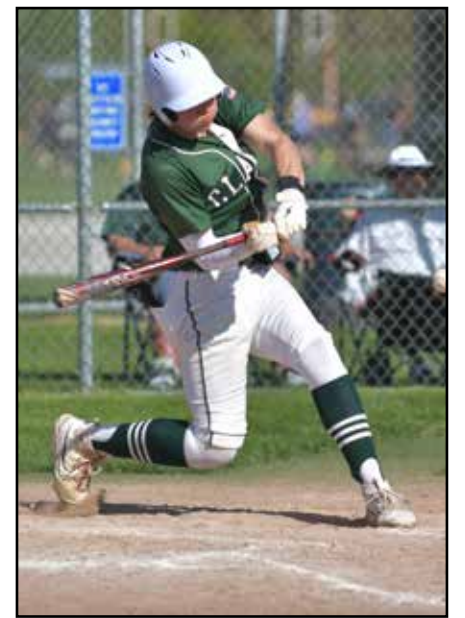
DIVISION 4

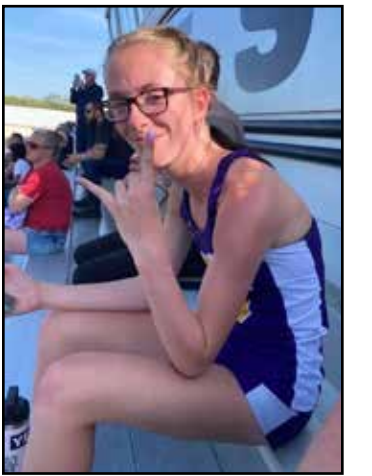
