In its first-ever appearance in a state

championship game, the Hemlock girls basketball team made the most of the opportunity as it defeated Blissfield 59-43 to win the Division 3 state championship. Regan Finkbeiner led the way for the Huskies with 19 points and four assists while Chloe Watson added 18 points and six rebounds and Lauren Borsenik added 16 points and seven rebounds. Hemlock, which finished the season with a 26-3 record, defeated Hart 57-26 in the semifinals to reach the title game.

"It's so surreal," said Hemlock coach Scott Neumeyer. "I'm proud of this team, especially the seniors.
