On the basketball court, a pair of girls basketball teams came home with state titles. Both Hemlock and Lansing Catholic navigated rugged challenges in the state tournament to capture state championships. For Hemlock, the title was the first in program history for the Huskie girls.

On the lanes, a pair of area bowling teams won state titles. The Holt girls won the state title in Division 1 while the Lansing Catholic boys won the state title in Division 3 giving the Cougars a pair of state championships during the winter season.

The spring season also saw an area team win a state championship. In baseball, Beal City captured the fifth state baseball title in school history.

1 Lowell Wrestling Extends State Title Streak
It was a milestone year for the Lowell wrestling team that seems to harvest state titles every season. Lowell made it a decade's worth of state titles as it defeated Goodrich 42-18 to win its 10th straight Division 2 state championship. Lowell marched through the finals in Kalamazoo as it defeated Birmingham Brother Rice 49-21 in the quarterfinals and Gaylord 51-7 in the state semifinals. Lowell wrestlers also made their mark at the individual state championships the following weekend as sophomore Jackson Blum won his second state title in as many years and senior CJ Poole won his first state individual title.

"This was really special," said Lowell coach R.J. Boudro. "This was a good, young group of kids and a good senior class. We had a pretty good season overall and the guys wrestled really good at team states."

2 Gladwin Football Team Turns In Perfect Season
History was made by the Gladwin football team as the Flying G's turned in a perfect season. Gladwin defeated Frankenmuth 10-7 in a defensive struggle to win the Division 5 state championship at Ford Field. Along with winning the first football state championship in school history, Gladwin completed its first-ever perfect season with a 14-0 record. Treyton Siegert kicked the game-winning field goal with just two seconds remaining on the clock to secure the win in what was a classic defensive struggle between the two teams.

"We knew it was going to be tough sledding," said Gladwin coach Marc Jarstfer. "I've been coming down here to the finals for a long time, and that's one of the better games that I've seen down here. Tough players all the way across the board."

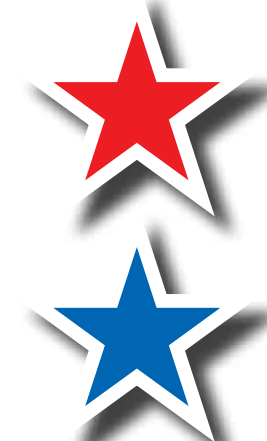

3 Hemlock Girls Win First-Ever State Basketball Title

In its first-ever appearance in a state championship game, the Hemlock girls basketball team made the most of the opportunity as it defeated Blissfield 59-43 to win the Division 3 state championship. Regan Finkbeiner led the way for the Huskies with 19 points and four assists while Chloe Watson added 18 points and six rebounds and Lauren Borsenik added 16 points and seven rebounds. Hemlock, which finished the season with a 26-3 record, defeated Hart 57-26 in the semifinals to reach the title game.

"It's so surreal," said Hemlock coach Scott Neumeyer. "I'm proud of this team, especially the seniors. People don't have an idea how much time players spend to get here with all the time outside of practice and summer stuff. I'm happy with how they approached the tournament run. We had a brutal schedule to get here."

4 Beal City Baseball Team Adds To State Title Collection

The Beal City baseball team added to impressive collection of state titles by winning the Division 4 state title this season. The title was the fifth in program history and the first since 2016. The Aggies, who finished the season with a 31-8 record, won title number five with a 2-1 win against Plymouth Christian Academy in the title game after stopping Kalamazoo Hackett 8-0 in the state semifinals.

"We're state champions and these guys deserve all the credit in the world," said Beal City coach Brad Antcliff. "The expectations they met today, it's hard. It's hard to get here and it's really hard to win it."

5 Lansing Catholic Girls Basketball Wins D2 State Title

The Lansing Catholic girls basketball team saved its best for last as it turned in a thrilling state tournament run that ended with the Division 2 state championship. The Cougars defeated multiple state-ranked teams during the tournament run. That run culminated in with a pair of thrilling wins in the final four. In the state semifinal game Lansing Catholic defeated the undefeated No. 1 team



in the state Grand Rapids West Catholic 59-41 behind 25 points from Anna Richards. The Cougars then stopped Frankenmuth 43-29 in the title game led by 16 points from Leah Richards.

"It was an incredible season that just kept building momentum," said Lansing Catholic coach Kacee Reid. "It wasn't a perfect season, we never played a perfect game, but the girls just kept working and believing in their preseason goals. Losing a few games early allowed us to focus on what we need to fix in order to compete with the better teams."

6 Pewamo-Westphalia Wins First-Ever Volleyball State Title

It was a historic season for the Pewamo-Westphalia volleyball team as the squad defeated Kalamazoo Christian three sets to one in the

Class C state title match to win the first-ever volleyball state championship in the history of the school.

Another highlight of the state tournament run was a quarterfinal win against Monroe St. Mary Catholic Central. St. Mary Catholic Central stopped Pewamo-Westphalia in the quarterfinals the season before and won the first set this year before the Pirates rallied to earn the win and propel themselves to the state title.

"I think we were better prepared this year," said Pewamo-Westphalia coach Jon Thelen. "We went to the quarterfinals last year. I returned a majority of that same team. We had a great season last year. I know all of those kids got another year of experience under their belts. You could see how sharp and experienced the team looked."

7 Midland Dow Boys Tennis Captured State Title

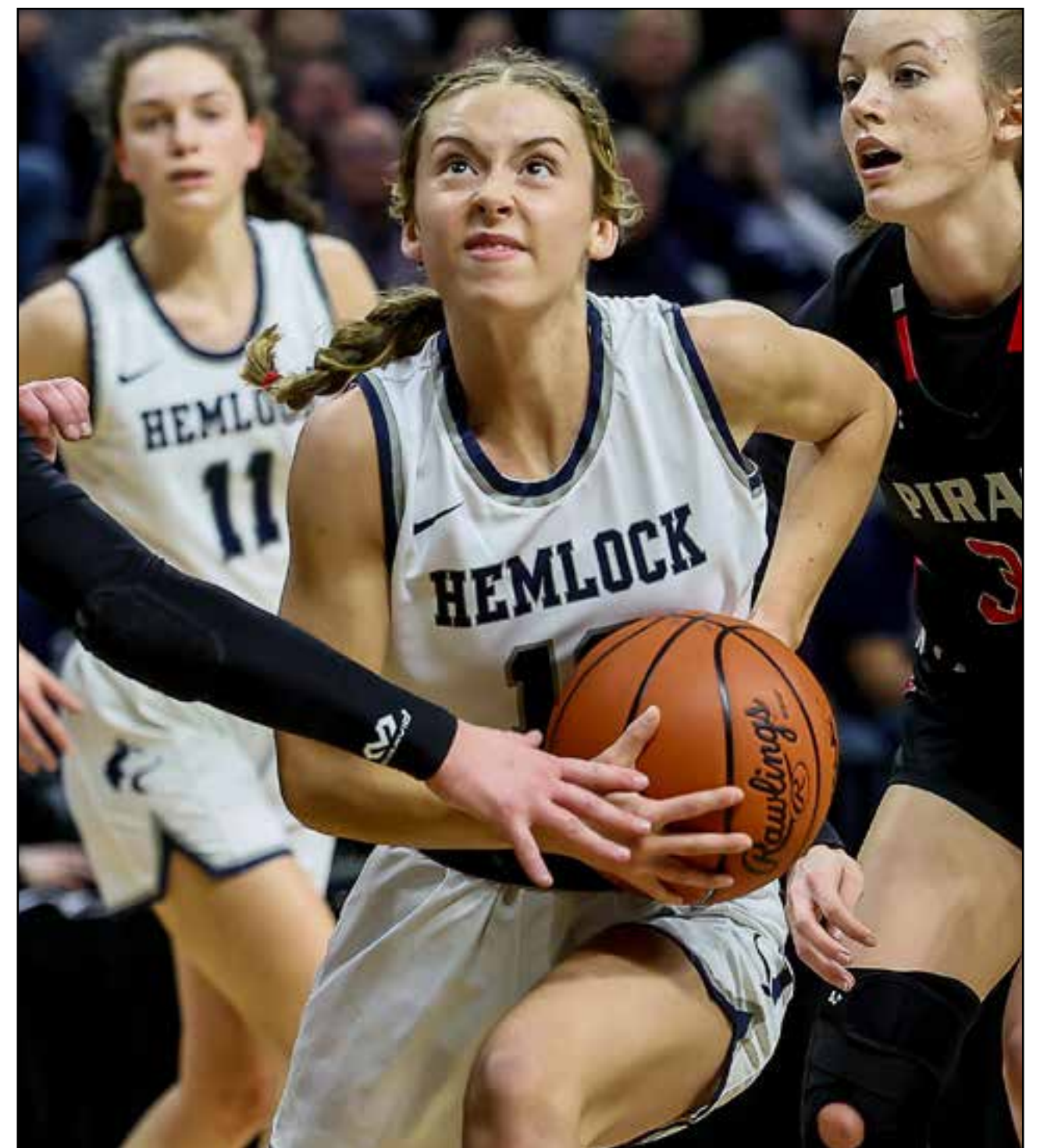
The Midland Dow boys tennis team found itself in a familiar position at the end of the season as the Chargers won the seventh state championship in program history. Competing in the Division 2 finals at the Midland Tennis Center, the Chargers enjoyed the home cooking as they totaled 32 team points to win their first state title since 2016. Dow was led by junior Aaron Li who won the state title at No. 2 singles and sophomore Nimai Patel who won the title at No. 4 singles. Dow also claimed a doubles title as the No. 2 doubles team of Roofy Elsaadany and Aiden Tanis took the crown.

"To watch everything play out on the court was pretty cool," said Dow coach Terry Schwartzkopf. "It was a while since we brought another title back to Dow, but I couldn't be prouder of a group of kids. Every time you win one of these its special."

8 Mt. Pleasant Sacred Heart Wins State Volleyball Crown

After several closed calls, the Mt. Pleasant Sacred Heart volleyball team came away with the big prize this season as it captured the Division 4 state championship. The Irish reached the final four in the 2021 state tournament and this year completed the final two steps to come away with the state championship trophy. Sacred Heart defeated Crystal Falls Forest Park in three sets in the semifinals and then in the finals the Irish staged a thrilling comeback to defeat Athens in five sets after dropping the first two sets.

"Coming into the season, it was a rebuilding year," said Sacred Heart coach Krista Davis. "We graduated eight seniors from that semifinals team (last year). To be honest, we were terrible in August. The only way to go was up. They showed up every day and put in the work."

9 Holt Girls Bowling Team Captures State Title
 The Holt girls bowling team saved its best for last this season as the Rams won the Division 1 state championship. The Rams, who went 10-2 during the regular season, were on their game during the state tournament capped by a winning effort at the Division 1 state finals at Thunderbowl Lanes in Detroit.

10 Lansing Catholic Boys Win State Bowling Title
 The Lansing Catholic boys bowling team showed that anything can happen once the state tournament begins. After going 9-6 during the regular season, the Cougars got hot at the right time as they defeated Ogemaw Heights in the state title match to capture the Division 3 state bowling title.

11 Frankenmuth Makes Appearance In State Football Finals
 For the second time in the past three seasons the Frankenmuth football team ended the season by playing for a state championship. Frankenmuth, which turned in a 13-1 record for the season, dropped a 10-7 defensive struggle to Gladwin in the Division 5 state championship game.

12 Frankenmuth Girls Basketball Reaches Title Game
 The Frankenmuth girls basketball team turned in a huge season that culminated with a berth in the Division 2 state championship game. Frankenmuth turned in a 24-3 record for the season which came to an end with a 43-29 loss against Lansing Catholic in the title game. The Eagles reached the final game after big wins against Houghton in the state quarterfinals and Goodrich in the state semifinals.



13 Merrill Reaches 8-Man Football State Title Game
 The Merrill football team showed how exciting 8-man football is as the Vandals went on a trilling state tournament run that ended with a berth in the 8-man Division 1 state championship game. Merrill finished the season with a 12-1 record after falling to Martin 74-20 in the title game.

14 Saginaw High Returns To The Breslin Center
 For the first time in 10 years the Saginaw High boys basketball team ended the season on the state's biggest stage at the Breslin Center in East Lansing. Saginaw advanced to the Division 2 state semifinals where it fell to eventual state champion Ferndale 65-60 despite 20 points from Javarie Holiday.

15 Mason Reaches State Semis In Football For Second Straight Season
 For the second consecutive season the Mason football team reached the state semifinals in Division 3. The Bulldogs, who turned in a 12-1 record, fell to eventual state champion Detroit King in the semifinals contest.

16 DeWitt Football Team Turns In Thrilling Playoff Run
 DeWitt continued its tradition of exciting games in the state football playoffs. The Panthers defeated Mt. Pleasant 56-49 in a triple-overtime thriller in the district finals and then stopped Linden for a regional title before falling 49-21 to Muskegon in the Division 3 state semifinals. The Panthers finished the season with a 9-4 overall record.

17 St. Charles Girls Basketball Team Makes History
 The St. Charles girls basketball team enjoyed a historic season. After dropping just two games during the regular season, St. Charles went on a memorable state tournament run that ended in the Division 4 state quarterfinals. The Bulldogs defeated Midland Calvary Baptist to win a district title and then topped Michigan Lutheran Seminary 39-34 to win the first regional title in St. Charles girls basketball history. St. Charles ended the season with a 24-3 record after dropping a 57-49 decision to Maple City Glen Lake in the state quarterfinals.

18 Alma Soccer Turns In Season To Remember
 The Alma boys soccer team turned in one of the finest seasons in team history. The Panthers turned in a regular-season record of 14-3-1 and finished second in the league with a 8-3-1 record. Alma continued the strong play into the state tournament as it defeated Big Rapids 3-1 in the district semifinals and then won the district title for the second time in three years with a 7-0 win against Clare. The district title was the third in program history. Alma then defeated Manistee 3-2 in the regional semifinals before dropping a 1-0 decision to Elk Rapids in the regional title game. Alma coach Nick O'Neill also won his 200th game as coach of Alma during the memorable season.

19 Grant Stahl Wins Individual Wrestling Title For Mt. Pleasant
 Mt. Pleasant senior Grant Stahl capped an impressive high school career in a big way as he won a state title at the Division 2 individual wrestling finals. Stahl finished the season with a perfect 41-0 record as he defeated a defending state champion to win the 132-pound state title. A three-time state placer, Stahl won over 130 matches during his high school career.

20 Evan Wakefield Snaps State Title Drought At MLS
 Evan Wakefield turned in a big senior season as he became the first wrestler in Michigan Lutheran Seminary history to win an individual state title since 1981. Wakefield won the 190-pound individual state championship in Division 4 as he claimed an overtime decision in the title match. Wakefield, who finished the season with a 54-1 record, wrapped up his career with a school-record 167 wins.

21 Charlotte Freshman Savannah Portillo Wins Individual Bowling Title
 Savannah Portillo of Charlotte wrapped up her freshman season in a big way as she captured the individual state title at the Division 2 bowling state finals. Portillo, who averaged 196 in league play during the season, defeated Fruitport senior Brynna Hanson 413-384 in the championship match.

22 Saginaw Nouvel Bowler Wins Individual Bowling State Title
 Saginaw Nouvel sophomore Alex McCarthy turned in a big season on the lanes. McCarthy, a two-time conference individual champion, posted a 202 average this year and capped the season by winning the Division 4 individual state championship.



23 Mason Boys Track Team Takes Second At State Meet
 The Mason boys track and field team utilized a total team effort and some key contributions from some young athletes to post a big season. Undefeated conference champions, Mason capped a big season by taking second in the state at the Division 2 state finals. Junior AJ Martel was one of the standouts for the Bulldogs this season as he was a state champion in the 300 hurdles.

24 Lansing Catholic Girls Golf Team Places Third In State
 A rebuilding year turned into a big season for the Lansing Catholic girls golf team. After graduating several key golfers from a team that finished runner-up at state in 2021, the Cougars turned a rebuilding season into a third-place finish in Division 4 this season. The team was led by junior Sophie Hauser who placed ninth overall as an individual.

25 St. Louis Wrestling Team Reaches State Semifinals
 The St. Louis wrestling team was one of the tops in the state in Division 4 this season. The Sharks, who finished the season with a record of 24-3, won an eighth straight district championship and a second straight regional title. The Sharks then defeated Benzie Central in the state quarterfinals before falling to Bronson in the Division 4 state semifinals.

26 New Lothrop Football Team Advances To State Semifinals
 New Lothrop continued its tradition of deep state playoff runs by advancing to the Division 7 state semifinals where it fell to Traverse City St. Francis. New Lothrop defeated Elkton-Pigeon-Bay Port to win the district title and then stopped Pewamo-Westphalia in the regional title game and ended the season with a 10-3 record.

27 Fowler Girls Basketball Reaches State Semifinals
 It may not have ended in a three-peat but the Fowler girls basketball team had a solid season none the less. The Eagles, who had won the two previous Division 4 state titles, reached the semifinals this season where they dropped a 46-44 decision to Baraga.

28 Jayden Schwartz Wraps Up Sterling Wrestling Career At Charlotte
 Jayden Schwartz put the finishing touches on one of the finest career in Charlotte wrestling this season. Schwartz became the seventh Charlotte wrestler to ever win an individual state title as he won the 138-pound title in Division 2. Schwartz, who won 52 matches this season, ended his career

with three school records and totaled 135 wins for his career.

29 Alma Athletes Win Titles At State Track And Field Finals
 A pair of Alma athletes came away with individual state championships at the Division 2 state track and field finals. Michael Howey, who set a new school record in the shot put this season, won the shot put state championship at the state finals. The Panthers also had a second champion in the field events as Jacoby Dunlap won the high jump competition.

30 Mt. Pleasant Sacred Heart Softball Reaches State Semifinals
 With several key freshman leading the way, the Mt. Pleasant Sacred Heart softball team showed that the future is bright as they went on a dazzling state tournament run that ended in the Division 4 state semifinals. After winning district and regional titles, the Irish reached the state semifinals where they dropped a 2-1 decision to eventual state champion Unionville-Sebewaing. Sacred Heart finished the season with a 33-10 record with the team that has several freshmen contributing.

31 Lansing Christian Volleyball Advances To State Semis
 The Lansing Christian volleyball team turned in a memorable season as it staged the deepest state tournament run in program history. After winning district and regional titles, the Pilgrims defeated Portland St. Patrick in the state quarterfinals before falling to Athens in the Division 4 state semifinals.

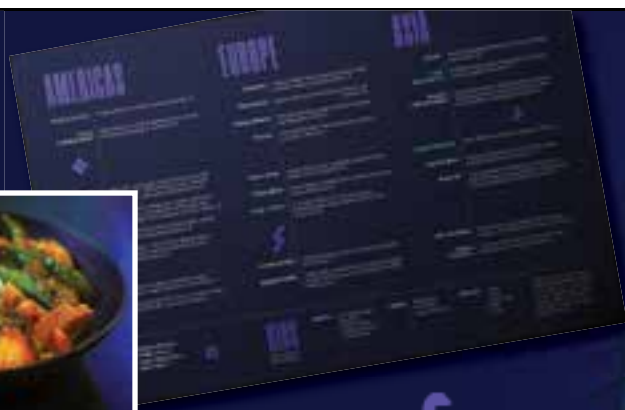

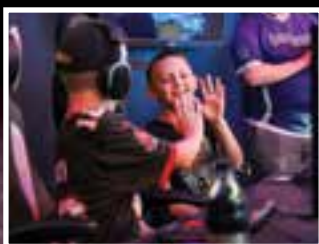
