Plethora Of Area Teams Capture Team District Championships

Area wrestling teams kicked off the 2024 team state tournaments with some outstanding efforts at the district level. Following is a look at area teams that brought home district championships this season before bowing out at the regional level.

DIVISION 1

Midland Edges Heritage For District Title

Midland claimed the title at the district hosted by Saginaw Arthur Hill by edging Saginaw Heritage 38-33 in the championship match.

Midland was led by Ethan Troupe (215 pounds) and Austin Anderson (120) who both won by pin while Dylon Anderson (126) and Lucas Berg (132) won by major decisions and Eamon Murray (285) and Thomas Miller (150) won by decisions.

Heritage reached the final by defeating Arthur Hill 60-18 in the semifinals.

Midland eventually reached the regional finals where it dropped a 51-26 decision to Davison. The Chemics reached the regional finals by defeating Traverse City West by forfeit in the regional semifinals.

Grand Ledge Wins First District In Three Years

The Grand Ledge wrestling team captured their first district title since 2021 when it defeated Jackson 59-18 to win the crown at the Holt district.

Grand Ledge reached the title match in impressive fashion with a 54-23 win against Holt. The win snapped Holt's string of 37

consecutive district titles.

Grand Ledge was led at the district by sophomores Logan Tollison (215 pounds) and Eben Abdo (120) who won both of their matches. Freshmen Sam Steinacker (190), Jackson Brown (113) and Ashton Delaney (165) also won two matches during the evening. Also picking up wins in the district title match were freshmen Timothy Hubert, Jack Bull and Maddoc Tazsreak, sophomore Christopher Houser, junior Jacob Crofut and senior Jordan Lam.

The season came to an end for Grand Ledge when the Comets fell 49-18 to Brighton in the regional semifinals.

DIVISION 2

Greenville Captures District Title

The Greenville Yellowjackets captured the title at the Cedar Springs district by defeating Forest Hills Eastern 51-9 in the title match.

Greenville reached the finals by turning back Cedar Springs 41-22 in the semifinals. Greenville was led in the Cedar match by Caleb Lewis (113 pounds), Kamden Witte (120) and Nick Earles (175). Case Johnson (215) and Alex Buskirk (144) added major decisions while Conner Peterman (138), Troy Courtney (150), Liam Dailey (157), Casey Eberspaker (165) and Naythan Dobson (190) added decisions in a close dual between long-time rivals.

Waverly Wrestling Bring Home District Crown

The Lansing Waverly wrestling team turned in a big season capped by winning the team district title at Lansing Sexton.

Waverly clinched the title by defeating

Waverly reached the title match by stopping Haslett 72-12 in the district semifinals.

The district title capped a big year that included a tie for second place CAAC Blue and a sixth-place finish out of 21 teams at the CAAC championships.

The season came to an end for Waverly when it dropped a 39-30 decision to Chelsea in the regional semifinals.

DeWitt Edges St. Johns In District Title Match

DeWitt claimed the title at the St. Johns district in thrilling fashion as it edged the host Redwings 39-38. In a match where every extra point was critical, DeWitt received pins from Trenden Bashore (132), Braelyn Smith (138), Kaden Lapaugh (144), Tyler Bashore (150) and Isaac Sovo (175) while Peyton Tatroe (126) won a key 7-5 decision.

DeWitt reached the title match by defeating Owosso 66-18 in the district semifinals.

The season came to an end for DeWitt in the regional semifinals when it dropped a 54-28 decision to Mason.

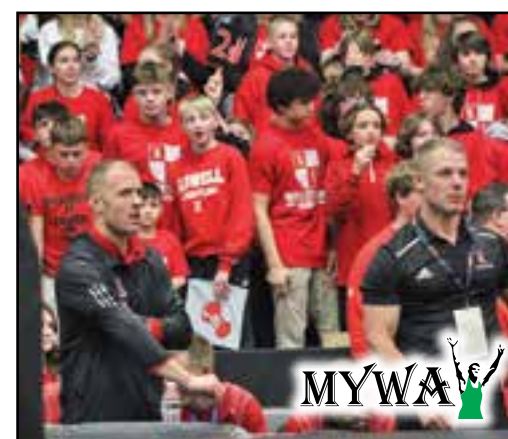

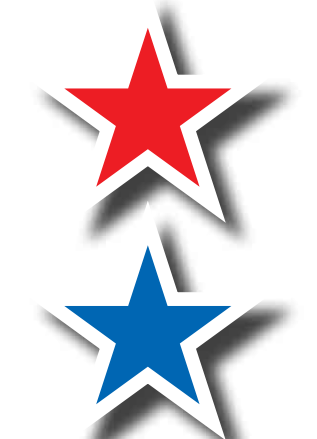
